

**10. d) Amendment to article 8 of the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court (Weapons which use microbial or other biological agents, or toxins)**

*New York, 14 December 2017*

**ENTRY INTO FORCE:** 2 April 2020 . The Amendment first entered into force on 2 April 2020 in regard to Luxembourg one year after the deposit of its instrument of ratification, in accordance with article 121(5) of the Rome Statute.

**REGISTRATION:** 2 April 2020, No. 38544.

**TEXT:** C.N.116.2018.TREATIES-XVIII-10 of 8 March 2018

*Note:* The Assembly of State Parties to the Rome Statute adopted the Amendment at its 16th Session held in New York from 4 to 14 December 2017 by Resolution ICC-ASP/16/Res.4. The amendment was circulated by the Secretary-General under cover of depositary notification C.N.116.2018.TREATIES-XVIII-10 of 8 March 2018.
