Daily Report Tuesday, 2 October 2007

8 States undertook 11 treaty actions today. Of that number, 4 States participated at the level of **Minister for Foreign Affairs**. There were a total of 2 signatures, and 9 ratifications, approvals, acceptances, accessions or like actions. A breakdown of the actions by treaty appears below.

Cumulative Report 25 to 27 September and 1 and 2 October 2007*

47 States** undertook 79 treaty actions from 25 to 27 September, and 1 to 2 October 2007. Of that number, 9 States participated at the level of **Head of State or Government** and 26 States participated at the level of **Minister for Foreign Affairs**. There were a total of 40 signatures, and 39 ratifications, approvals, acceptances, accessions or like actions. A breakdown of the actions by treaty appears below.
