2009 TREATY EVENT MULTILATERAL TREATY FRAMEWORK: TOWARDS UNIVERSAL PARTICIPATION AND IMPLEMENTATION

UNITED NATIONS HEADQUARTERS 23-25 AND 28-29 SEPTEMBER 2009

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

It is recalled that a series of successful treaty events have been held annually at the Headquarters of the United Nations commencing with the Millennium Summit in 2000. An impressive total of over 1,446 treaty actions (signatures, ratifications, etc.) have been undertaken at these treaty events. In 2008, the treaty event was held during the sixty-third General Assembly general debate, and 44 States undertook a total of 84 treaty actions.

This year, the annual treaty event will be held from 23 to 25 and 28 to 29 September 2009 at United Nations Headquarters in New York, to coincide with the general debate of the sixty-fourth General Assembly. The 2009 Treaty Event: Towards Universal Participation and Implementation provides a distinct opportunity for States to demonstrate their continuing commitment to the central role of the rule of law in international relations. This year's event will highlight treaties of global reach such as climate change, terrorism, human rights, transnational organized crime, statelessness and the use of nuclear and other weapons that adversely affect civilians.

The list of treaties being highlighted during the 2009 treaty event is attached. As is customary, it will be possible to undertake treaty actions with regard to any treaty deposited with the Secretary-General during the treaty event.

Delegations intending to sign or deposit instruments during the treaty event relating to multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General may wish to inform their Governments accordingly for the purpose of completing the requisite domestic procedures in time.

The publication 2009 Treaty Event: Towards Universal Participation and Implementation is currently being compiled and will be circulated to all Permanent Missions in New York shortly. The publication will contain summaries of key provisions, relevant final clauses and status of treaties being highlighted in the 2009 treaty event.
