# 2009 Treaty Event: Towards Universal Participation and Implementation

### **Daily Report**

## Friday, 25 September 2009

Today the Treaty Section registered 21 treaty actions by 11 States. Of that number, 1 State participated at the level of **Head of State** and 8 States participated at the level of **Minister for Foreign Affairs.** 

There were a total of 8 signatures, 10 ratifications and 3 accessions. A breakdown of the actions by treaty appears below.

### Human rights and statelessness

- Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Economic, Social and Cultural Rights, 2008 (Signature by El Salvador, Madagascar, Republic of Congo, Guinea Bissau, Togo and Azerbaijan);
- **Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, 2006** (Ratification by the Lao People's Democratic Republic);
- Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, 1966 (Accession by Brazil);
- Second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, aiming at the abolition of the death penalty, 1989 (Accession by Brazil);
- International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, 1966 (Ratification by the Lao People's Democratic Republic);
- **Convention relating to the status of Stateless Persons,1954** (Ratification by Lichtenstein);
- Convention on the Reduction of Statelessness, 1961 (Accession by Lichtenstein).

### Terrorism, organized crimes, and penal matters

- United Nations Convention against Corruption, 2003 (Ratification by the Lao People's Democratic Republic);
- International Convention for the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism, 2005 (Ratification by Lichtenstein and Brazil).

• Convention on Cluster Munitions, 2008 (Ratification by France and Burundi);

### **Recently adopted agreements**

• Convention on Contracts for the International Carriage of Goods Wholly or Partly by Sea, 2008 (Signature by Madagascar);

- Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties, 1969 (Ratification by Brazil with Reservations);
- Agreement to establish the South Centre, 1994 (Ratification by Brazil).
