## *Final Report* 21<sup>st</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> September 2010

Twenty-six (26) States undertook forty-four (44) treaty actions during the five days of the 2010 Treaty Event. Of that number, three (3) participated at the level of **Head of Government**, twenty-two (22) participated at the **ministerial level** and **two** (2) at the level of Permanent Representative to the United Nations. There were a total of seventeen (17) signatures, fifteen (15) ratifications, nine (9) accessions and three (3) consents to be bound. A breakdown of the actions by treaty appears below.
