
2012 Treaty Event: Strengthening the Rule of Law

Daily Report

Wednesday, 26 September 2012

Today twenty nine (29) treaty actions were effected with the Secretary-General by twelve (12) Member States; and one (1) Non-member State. One (1) Member State participated at the level of Head of State, ten (10) Member States including one Non-member State participated at the level of Minister of Foreign Affairs, and two (2) Member States participated with representatives from other ministries.

There were a total of ten (10) signatures, seven (7) ratifications, two (2) acceptances, nine (9) accessions, and one (1) declaration recognizing as compulsory the jurisdiction of the International Court of Justice under Article 36, paragraph 2, of the Statute of the Court.
