CONVENTION ON THE PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES OF THE SPECIALIZED AGENCIES, APPROVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE UNITED NATIONS ON 21 NOVEMBER 1947 COMMUNICATION FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND Sir.

I am directed by the Secretary-General to refer to letters C.N.17.1966.TREATIES-2 of 16 February 1966, C.N.48.1966.TREATIES-5 of 4 April 1966, C.N.61.1966.TREATIES-9 of 4 May 1966 and C.N.239.1966. TREATIES-17 of 2 February 1967, relating to the accession by the Governments of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Czechoslovak Socialist Republic, respectively, to the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies, approved by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 21 November 1947.

I have the honour to inform you that, on 20 June 1967, the Secretary-General received the following communication from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with respect to the reservations accompanying the instruments of accession to the said Convention by the Governments of the above-mentioned States:

"Her Majesty's Government would wish to put on record that they are unable to accept these reservations because, in their view, they are not of the kind which intending parties to the Convention have the right to make."
