AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF UNIFORM CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL AND RECIPROCAL RECOGNITION OF APPROVAL FOR MOTOR VEHICLE EQUIPMENT AND PARTS DONE AT GENEVA ON 20 MARCH 1958

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY THE NETHERLANDS TO REGULATION NO. 37 ANNEXED TO THE ABOVE-MENTIONED AGREEMENT

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

In a communication received on 20 April 1987, the Government of the Netherlands has proposed, in accordance with article 12, paragraph 1, of the above-mentioned Agreement, certain amendments to Regulation No. 37 ("Uniform provisions concerning the approval of filament lamps for use in approved lamp units of power-driven vehicles and of their trailers") annexed to the Agreement.

A copy, in the English and French languages, of the document containing the text of the proposed amendments is transmitted herewith (supplement 2 to the "03 series": doc. TRANS/SC1/WP29/176).

In this connexion, the Secretary-General wishes to draw attention to paragraph 1 of article 12 of the said Agreement, which reads as follows:

"Any Contracting Party applying a Regulation may propose one or more amendments to it. The text of any proposed amendment to a Regulation shall be transmitted to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, who shall transmit it to the other Contracting Parties. The amendment shall be deemed to have been accepted unless within a period of three months following this notification a Contracting Party applying the Regulation has expressed an objection, in which case the amendment shall be deemed to have been rejected. If the amendment is deemed to have been accepted, it shall enter into force at the end of a further period of two months."
