PROPOSAL OF CORRECTIONS TO THE REGULATIONS ANNEXED TO ADN

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The ADN Safety Committee has drawn the attention of the Secretary-General to certain errors in the English and French texts of the Regulations annexed to ADN and requested that the corresponding corrections be transmitted as soon as possible to Contracting Parties for acceptance (ECE/TRANS/WP.15/AC.2/32, para.31).

The texts of the proposed corrections are contained in Annex II of the report of the ADN Safety Committee of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe on its session of 24 to 28 August 2009 (ECE/TRANS/WP.15/AC.2/32).

Unless there is an objection from interested Parties, the Secretary-General proposes to correct the English and French texts of the annexed Regulations accordingly.
