## CUSTOMS CONVENTION ON THE INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORT OF GOODS UNDER COVER OF TIR CARNETS (TIR CONVENTION) GENEVA, 14 NOVEMBER 1975

## PROPOSAL OF AMENDMENTS TO THE BODY OF THE CONVENTION

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

On 4 November 2020, the Administrative Committee for the 1975 TIR Convention of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) transmitted to the Secretary-General, in accordance with the provisions of article 59 (1) and (2) of the Convention, proposals of amendments to the body of the Convention, adopted at its seventy-third session, held virtually and in-person in Geneva on 14 and 15 October 2020.

The text of the proposals of amendments is contained in annexes III and VI of document ECE/TRANS/WP.30/AC.2/2020/20 and is available on the website of the UNECE Sustainable Transport Division at the following addresses:

In connection with the above-mentioned proposed amendments, reference is made to the procedure set forth in article 59, paragraph 3, of the Convention which reads as follows:

"3. Except as provided for under Article 60, any proposed amendment communicated in accordance with the preceding paragraph shall come into force with respect to all Contracting parties three months after the expiry of a period of twelve months following the date of communication of the proposed amendment during which period no objection to the proposed amendment has been communicated to the Secretary-General of the United Nations by a State which is a Contracting Party."

In accordance with the provisions of article 59 (3) of the Convention, the above-mentioned proposed amendments will come into force with respect to all Contracting Parties three months after the expiry of a period of twelve months following the date of this communication during which no objection to the proposed amendments has been communicated to the Secretary-General of the United Nations by a State which is a Contracting Party.
