CONVENTION ON ROAD TRAFFIC AND PROTOCOL ON ROAD SIGNS AND SIGNALS, DONE AT GENEVA ON 19 SEPTEMBER 1949

ACCESSION BY SPAIN

Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary-General to inform You that, on 13 February 1958, the instruments of accession by the Government of Spain to the Convention on Road Traffic and to the Protocol on Road Signs and Signals, done at Geneva on 19 September 1949, were deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations in accordance with the terms of article 27 (2) of the Convention and article 56 (2) of the Protocol.

In accordance with its article 29, the Convention will come into force for Spain on the thirtieth day after the deposit of the instrument of accession, that is to say, on 15 March 1958.

In accordance with article 58, the Protocol on Road Signs and Signals will come into force for Spain fifteen months after the deposit of the instrument of accession, that is to say, on 13 May 1959.

In the note transmitting the instruments of accession, the Government of Spain declared, in accordance with article 28 of the Convention and article 57 of the Protocol, that the Convention and Protocol will be applicable to African localities and provinces ("Plazas y Provincias africanas").

In the same note, the Government of Spain also notified the Secretary-General that the distinctive letter (E/- has been selected for Spain as the distinguishing sign of the place of registration of motor vehicles in international traffic.
