
NOTIFICATION BY THE CONGO (LEOPOLDVILLE)

Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary-General to refer to letter C.N.29.1961.TREATIES-4 of 29 March 1961, relating to the notification by the Government of the Congo by which it considers itself bound by the Convention on Road Traffic, done at Geneva on 19 September 1949.

I have the honour to inform you that, by a communication received on 29 November 1963, the Government of the Congo has notified the Secretary-General that the distinctive letters - CGO - have been selected for the Congo (Leopoldville) as the distinguishing sign of the place of registration of vehicles in international traffic, in accordance with paragraph 3 of Annex 4 to the above-mentioned Convention.
