
Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary-General to refer to letters C.N.153.1960.TREATIES-1 of 25 October 1960, C.N.122.1962.TREATIES-4 of 20 June 1962, C.N.218.1963.TREATIES-7 of 15 November 1963 and C.N.156.1965.TREATIES-2 of 20 October 1965, relating to the accession by the Governments of Bulgaria, Mongolia, Algeria and Nepal, respectively, to the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the United Nations, approved by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 13 February 1946.

I have the honour to inform you that, on 20 June 1967, the Secretary-General received the following communication from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with respect to the reservations accompanying the instruments of accession to the said Convention by the Governments of the above-mentioned States:

"Her Majesty's Government wish to put on record that they are unable to accept these reservations because, in their view, they are not of the kind which intending parties to the Convention have the right to make."
