
Sir,

I am directed by the Secretary-General to refer to letter C.N.109.1967.TREATIES-4 of 28 August 1967, relating to the deposit of the instrument of accession by the Government of the Hungarian People's Republic to the Convention on the Privileges and Immunities of the Specialized Agencies, approved by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 21 November 1947.

I have the honour to inform you that, on 11 January 1968, the Secretary-General received the following communication from the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland with respect to the reservations contained in the above-mentioned instrument of accession:

"Her Majesty's Government would wish to put on record that they are unable to accept these reservations because, in their view, they are not of the kind which intending parties to the Convention have the right to make."
