ACCESSION BY THE GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC

Sir,


I have the honour, upon instructions from the Secretary-General, to inform you that, on 11 October 1973, the instruments of accession by the Government of the German Democratic Republic to the Convention on Road Traffic, and to the Convention on Road Signs and Signals, both done at Vienna on 8 November 1968, were deposited with the Secretary-General.

The instruments of accession contain the following declaration:

(Translation) In connexion with its accession to the two Conventions referred to above, the Government of the German Democratic Republic declares that it does not consider itself bound by article 52 of the Convention on Road Traffic or by article 44 of the Convention on Road Signs and Signals.

On depositing the above-mentioned instruments, the Government of the German Democratic Republic notified the Secretary-General, with reference to paragraph 4 of article 45 of the Convention on Road Traffic, that it had selected the distinguishing sign "DDR" for display in international traffic on vehicles registered by it, and in accordance with article 46(2) of the Convention on Road Signs and Signals, that it has also selected the model Aa as a danger warning sign and the model 2,b as a stop sign.

CORRIGENDUM

Sir,

I have the honour to refer to letter C.N.208.1973.TREATIES-3 dated 20 November 1973 concerning the accession by the German Democratic Republic to the Convention on Road Signals done at Vienna on 8 November 1968.

In a communication dated 26 November 1973, the Permanent Representative of the German Democratic Republic to the United Nations informed the Secretary-General that, in accordance with article 46(2) of the Convention, the Government of the German Democratic Republic had decided to apply model B,2a for stop sign and not model B,2 as indicated in letter C.N.208.1973.TREATIES-3.
