AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF UNIFORM CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL AND
RECIPROCAL RECOGNITION OF APPROVAL FOR MOTOR VEHICLE EQUIPMENT AND PARTS
DONE AT GENEVA ON 20 MARCH 1958

ACCESSION BY DENMARK


Sir,

I have the honour, upon instructions from the Secretary-General, to inform you that, on 21 October 1976, the instrument of accession by the Government of Denmark to the Agreement concerning the Adoption of Uniform Conditions of Approval and Reciprocal Recognition of Approval for Motor Vehicle Equipment and Parts, done at Geneva on 20 March 1958, was deposited with the Secretary-General.

In a letter accompanying the said instrument, the Government of Denmark declared, under article 1 paragraph 6 of the above-mentioned Agreement, that it does not intend to apply Regulations Nos. 6, 9, 10, 13, 15, 24, 30, 32, 33, 34, 35 and 36 annexed to the Agreement and that the latter will not apply to the Faroe Islands.

In accordance with its article 7 (2), the Agreement will enter into force for Denmark on the sixtieth day after the deposit of the instrument of accession, that is to say on 20 December 1976. As far as Regulation No. 23 annexed to the Agreement is concerned, you will note that this regulation, pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 2 of article 12 of the Agreement, shall not enter into force for the Government of Denmark until two months after it will have formally accepted the amendment to the said regulation proposed by the Government of Czechoslovakia (see letter C.N.324.TREATIES-24 of 22 October 1976) or two months after a period of three months since the communication to that State of the text of the amendment in question.
