AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY THE UNITED KINGDOM  
OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND TO ARTICLES 3, 6, 10,  
11, 12 AND 14 OF THE AGREEMENT:

NOTIFICATION BY THE NETHERLANDS UNDER ARTICLE 23 (2) (b)  
OF THE AGREEMENT

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, and referring to depositary notification C.N.399.1981.TREATIES-1 of 2 February 1982 communicating the text of certain amendments proposed by the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland to articles 3, 6, 10, 11, 12 and 14 of the European Agreement concerning the Work of Crews of Vehicles Engaged in International Road Transport (AETR) done at Geneva on 1 July 1970, communicates the following:

In a communication received on 28 July 1982, the Government of the Netherlands notified the Secretary-General, in accordance with article 23 (2) (b) of the above-mentioned Agreement, that although it intended to accept the proposal of the Government of the United Kingdom, the conditions necessary for such acceptance were not yet fulfilled in respect of the Netherlands.

In view of the above, and in keeping with the provisions of paragraphs 2 to 7 of article 23, the proposed amendments will be deemed to have been accepted only if, before the expiry of a period of nine months following the expiry of the period of six months indicated in depositary notification C.N.399.1981.TREATIES-1 of 2 February 1982, i.e., before 3 May 1983, the Government of the Netherlands has not notified an objection to the said proposed amendments (unless the Government of the Netherlands notifies its acceptance before 3 May 1983, in which case the amendments will be deemed to be accepted on the date of such acceptance). The Secretary-General will not fail to inform all States concerned of any development in this respect.
