DECLARATIONS BY DENMARK AND ITALY

ACCEPTANCE OF THE AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY  
THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY TO ANNEX 1 OF THE AGREEMENT

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, and referring to depositary notification C.N.106.1986.TREATIES-4 of 24 July 1986 concerning, inter alia, objections made by the Governments of Denmark and Italy to amendments proposed by the Federal Republic of Germany to Annex 1 of the above-mentioned Agreement, communicates the following:

On 14 January and 11 February 1987, respectively, the Secretary-General received the following declarations from the Governments of Denmark and Italy in regard to the above-mentioned objections:

DENMARK

(Original: English)

"At the 42nd meeting of Group of Experts on the Transport of Perishable Foodstuffs, held in Geneva 22-24 October 1986, the original German proposal to amend certain paragraphs in annex 1, appendix 1 of the Agreement on the International Carriage of Perishable Foodstuffs and on the Special Equipment to be Used for such Carriage (ATP), concluded at Geneva on 1 September 1970, was discussed.

In the light of this discussion Denmark decides to withdraw its previous objection, as stated in Depositary Notification C.N.106.1986.TREATIES-4 of 24 July 1986.

[The Government of Denmark] further refers to the report of the Forty-second session of the Group of Experts in Geneva 22-24 October 1986 (trans/ge.11/31) paras 12-12."

ITALY

(Translation) (Original: French)

[The Government of Italy] has the honour to notify that Italy withdraws its objections to the amendments proposed by the Federal Republic of Germany to annex 1, appendix 1, of the above-mentioned Agreement.

Taking into account the above-mentioned declarations by the Governments of Denmark and Italy, and the absence of objections by the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany before the expiry of nine months following the expiry of the period of six months as of the date of circulation of the proposed amendments (see depositary notification C.N.280.1985.TREATIES-4 of 11 November 1985), the Secretary-General considers that no objections have been received within the meaning and for the purpose of article 18, and that accordingly the amendments are deemed accepted as at 11 February 1987. (Accordingly, notification C.N.106.1986.TREATIES-4 of 24 July 1986, in as far as it indicated that the amendments had been rejected, should be disregarded).

Unless therefore the Secretary-General receives an objection to the above within 90 days, the amendments will enter into force on 11 August 1987, i.e. six months after their acceptance, in accordance with article 18 (6).
