MULTILATERAL TREATIES DEPOSITED WITH THE SECRETARY-GENERAL
SUCCESION BY THE CZECH REPUBLIC

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

On 2 June 1993, the Government of the Czech Republic notified the Secretary-General that it considered itself bound, by virtue of succession to the Czech and Slovak Republic, by the treaties¹ listed below, with effect from 1 January 1993, the date on which the Czech Republic assumed responsibility for its international relations. The succession to the said treaties includes the reservations and declarations to their provisions made earlier by the Czech and Slovak Federal Republic, the text of which can be found in chapter eleven of the publication Multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General:
