AMENDMENTS PROPOSED BY NORWAY

NOTIFICATION BY THE NETHERLANDS UNDER ARTICLE 23 (2) (b)  
OF THE AGREEMENT

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, and referring to depositary notification C.N.285.1993.TREATIES-3 of 30 August 1993 communicating the text of certain amendments proposed by the Government of Norway of the European Agreement concerning the Work of Crews of Vehicles Engaged in International Road Transport (AETR) done at Geneva on 1 July 1970, communicates the following:

In a communication received on 28 February 1994, the Government of the Netherlands notified the Secretary-General, in accordance with article 23 (2) (b) of the above-mentioned Agreement, that although it intended to accept the proposal of the Government of the Netherlands the conditions necessary for such acceptance were not yet fulfilled in respect of the Netherlands.

In view of the above, and in keeping with the provisions of paragraphs 2 to 7 of article 23, the proposed amendments will be deemed to have been accepted only if, before the expiry of a period of nine months following the expiry of the period of six months indicated in depositary notification C.N.285.1993.TREATIES-3 of 30 August 1993, i.e. before 30 November 1994, the Government of the Netherlands has not notified an objection to the said proposed amendments (unless the Government of the Netherlands notifies its acceptance before 30 November 1994 in which case the amendments will be deemed to be accepted on the date of such acceptance). The Secretary-General will not fail to inform all States concerned of any development in this respect.
