DONE AT GENEVA ON 20 MARCH 1958

SUCCESSION BY CROATIA

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS NOS. 13 AND 90 BY DENMARK

APPLICATION OF REGULATION NO. 91 BY FINLAND

APPLICATION OF REGULATIONS NOS. 72 AND 81 BY GERMANY

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

I

On 1 February 1994, the Government of Denmark notified the Secretary-General that it intends to apply Regulation Nos. 13 and 90 annexed to the above-mentioned Agreement:

Regulation No. 13: Uniform provisions concerning the approval of vehicles with regard to braking

Regulation No. 90: Uniform provisions concerning the approval of replacement brake lining assemblies for power-driven vehicles and their trailers

II

On 2 February 1994, the Government of Finland notified the Secretary-General that it intends to apply Regulation No. 91 annexed to the above-mentioned Agreement:

Regulation No. 91: Uniform provisions concerning the approval of side-marker lamps for motor vehicles and their trailers

III

On 2 and 18 February 1994, respectively, the Government of Germany notified the Secretary-General that it intends to apply Regulation Nos. 81 and 72 annexed to the above-mentioned Agreement:

Regulation No. 81: Uniform provisions concerning the approval of rear-view mirrors, and of two-wheeled power-driven vehicles with or without side car with regard to the installation of rear-view mirrors on handlebars

Regulation No. 72: Uniform provisions concerning the approval of motorcycle headlamps emitting an asymmetrical passing beam and a driving beam and equipped with halogen lamps (HS1 lamps)

In accordance with article 1 (8) of the Agreement, the said Regulations are to enter into force on the sixtieth day after the receipt of the corresponding notifications, i.e. for Denmark on 2 April 1994, for Finland on 3 April 1994 and for Germany, with respect to Regulation No. 81 on 3 April 1994, and with respect to Regulation No. 72 on 19 April 1994.

The addresses of the national administrative and technical authorities competent for the purposes of these and other regulations may be obtained from the Transport Division of the Economic Commission for Europe (Palais des Nations, Bureau 334, 1211 Genève 10).

IV

On 17 March 1994, the notification of succession by the Government of Croatia to the above-mentioned Agreement, as well as annexed Regulations Nos. 1 to 11, 13 to 26, 28, 30, 35, 37 to 41, 43, 47 to 51, 53 to 58, 63, 69, 70 and 78, was deposited with the Secretary-General, with effect from 8 October 1991, the date on which Croatia assumed responsibility for its international relations.
