The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

On 1 April 1998, the notification of succession by the Government of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to the above Agreement was deposited with the Secretary-General, with effect from 17 November 1991, the date on which the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia assumed responsibility for its international relations.
