PROPOSAL OF AMENDMENTS OF ANNEX 6 RELATING TO ARTICLE 38,  
PARAGRAPH 1 OF THE CONVENTION

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

On 17 June 2003, the Administrative Committee for the 1975 TIR Convention of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) transmitted to the Secretary-General, in accordance with the provisions of article 59 (1) and (2) of the Convention, a proposal to delete Explanatory Note 0.38.1 of Annex 6 relating to Article 38, paragraph 1 of the above Convention adopted at its thirty-third session held in Geneva on 24 and 25 October 2002.

In connection with the amendments to annex 6 of the Convention, reference is made to the procedure set forth in article 60 (1) of the Convention, which reads as follows:

- “1. Any proposed amendment to annexes 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 considered in accordance with paragraphs 1 and 2 of article 59 shall come into force on a date to be determined by the Administrative Committee at the time of its adoption, unless by a prior date determined by the Administrative Committee at the same time, one-fifth or five of the States which are Contracting Parties, whichever number is less, notify the Secretary-General of the United Nations of their objection to the amendment. Determination by the Administrative Committee of the dates referred to in this paragraph shall be by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting.

2. On entry into force, any amendment adopted in accordance with the procedure set out in paragraph 1 above shall for all Contracting Parties replace and supersede any previous provisions to which amendment refers.”

In accordance with the provisions of article 60 (1) of the Convention, the Administrative Committee decided that the Secretary-General of the United Nations should be notified of objections to the proposed amendment not later than 7 August 2003 and that, unless there were a sufficient number of objections, the amendment would enter into force on 7 November 2003.
