ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO REGULATION NO. 7<sup>1</sup>

communicates the following:

Within the period of six months following the date of depositary notification  
C.N.600.2006.TREATIES-1 of 2 August 2006, none of the Contracting Parties applying Regulation  
No. 7 expressed disagreement with the proposed amendments. Therefore, in accordance with paragraph  
2 of article 12 of the Agreement, the proposed amendments are considered to be adopted and are  
binding upon all Contracting Parties applying Regulation No. 7 as of 2 February 2007.
