ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO REGULATION NO. 34¹

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary,
communicates the following:

Within the period of six months following the date of depositary notification
C.N.205.2009.TREATIES-1 of 24 April 2009, none of the Contracting Parties applying Regulation
No. 34 expressed disagreement with the proposed amendments. Therefore, in accordance with
paragraph 2 of article 12 of the Agreement, the proposed amendments are considered to be adopted and
are binding upon all Contracting Parties applying Regulation No. 34 as of 24 October 2009.
