PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1st March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

1. Supreme Decree No. 116-2018-PCM was issued on 28 November 2018.¹
2. The Supreme Decree declares the state of emergency for a period of sixty (60) calendar days, with effect from 29 November 2018, in the Province of Putumayo, Department of Loreto.
3. During the state of emergency established by the aforementioned Supreme Decree, the rights relating to liberty and security of person, inviolability of the home and freedom of assembly and movement within the territory, recognized in articles 9, 17, 12 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, are suspended.
4. The present state of emergency was declared in order to ensure the maintenance of public order and to prevent acts of violence or any criminal offense that could be committed in that area.
