The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- 1. Supreme Decree No. 079-2019-PCM was issued on 18 April 2019.<sup>1</sup>
- 2. The Supreme Decree declares the state of emergency for a period of sixty (60) calendar days, with effect from 20 April 2019, in the districts of Madre de Dios and Huepetuhe in the Province of Manu, Department of Madre de Dios.
- 3. The Supreme Decree extends furthermore the state of emergency for a period of sixty (60) calendar days, with effect from 20 April 2019, in the districts of Tambopata, Inambari, Las Piedras and Laberinto in the Province of Tambopata, Department of Madre de Dios.
- 4. During the state of emergency established by the aforementioned Supreme Decree, the rights relating to liberty and security of person, inviolability of the home and freedom of assembly and movement within the territory, recognized in articles 9, 17, 21 and 12 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, are suspended.
- 5. The present state of emergency was declared in order to ensure the maintenance of public order and to prevent acts of violence or any criminal offense that could be committed in that area.
