INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

1. Supreme Decree No. 160-2019-PCM was issued on 20 September 2019.¹
2. The Supreme Decree extends the state of emergency declared for a period of sixty (60) calendar days, with effect from 26 September until 24 November 2019, in the districts of Ayahuanco, Santillana, Sivia, Llochegua, Canayre, Uchuraccay and Pucacolpa of the Province of Huanta and in the districts of Anco, Ayna, Chungui, Santa Rosa, Samugari, Anchiuay of the Province of La Mar of the department of Ayacucho; in the districts of Huachocolpa, Surcubamba, Tintaypuncu, Roble, Andaymarca and Colcabamba of the Province of Tayacaja and in the districts of Chinchihuasi, Pachamarca, San Pedro de Coris of the Province of Churcampa of the department of Huancavelica; in the districts of Echarate, Kimbiri, Pichari, Villa Kintiarina and Villa Virgen of the Province of La Convención in the Department of Cusco; and, in the districts of Mazamari, Pangoa, Vizcátan del Ene, Río Tambo of the Province of Satipo, in the district of Andamarca of the Province of Concepción and in the districts of Santo Domingo de Acobamba and Pariahuanca of the Province of Huancayo of the Department of Junín.

3. During the state of emergency established by the aforementioned Supreme Decree, the rights relating to liberty and security of person, inviolability of the home and freedom of assembly and movement within the territory, recognized in articles 9, 17, 21 and 12 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, are suspended.
4. The present state of emergency was declared in order to ensure the maintenance of public order and to prevent acts of violence or any criminal offense that could be committed in that area.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
