INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)¹

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- Through Supreme Decree No. 068-2023-PCM, dated 3 June 2023, the Government of Peru extended the state of emergency declared through Supreme Decree No. 046-2023-PCM, in the districts of Tambopata, Inambari, Las Piedras and Laberinto in the province of Tambopata; and in the districts of Madre de Dios and Huepetuhe in the province of Manu in the department of Madre de Dios, for a period of sixty (60) calendar days starting on 6 June 2023.
- The measure was extended to combat and neutralize illegal mining and related offences that have a negative impact on the normal activities of citizens. During the state of emergency, the constitutional rights relating to liberty and security of person, inviolability of the home, and freedom of assembly and movement in the territory, included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, are suspended.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
