PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 136-2024-PCM,<sup>1</sup> published on 6 December 2024, the state of emergency declared in the province of Trujillo of the department of La Libertad was extended for a period of 30 calendar days starting on 10 December 2024.
- The state of emergency was extended owing to continuing criminality, as reflected in various crimes, including murder, robbery and theft, and the increase in crimes against property (extortion) committed by criminal organizations using firearms and explosives, affecting public order. In this context, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, freedom of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly and liberty and security of person, as outlined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Political Constitution of Peru, and those included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
