PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 041-2025-PCM,<sup>1</sup> published on 27 March 2025, the state of emergency declared in the fourteen (14) districts and six (6) population centres detailed below has been extended for sixty (60) calendar days beginning 1 April 2025:

- The reason for the extension of the state of emergency, given the continuity of terrorist activities and drug trafficking, is to enable the Armed Forces to continue deploying military actions and operations in the area of responsibility of the VRAEM Special Command (CE-VRAEM). In this regard, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to freedom of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, included in paragraphs 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Political Constitution of Peru, and those included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
