## INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

## PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 044-2025-PCM,<sup>1</sup> published on 4 April 2025, a state of emergency was declared in the districts of Ayna, Santa Rosa, Anchihuay and Río Magdalena in the province of La Mar (department of Ayacucho) for a period of 60 calendar days starting on 5 April 2025.
- This measure was adopted in view of ongoing illegal drug trafficking crimes committed by gangs and criminal organizations which affect internal order in those areas of the country. In this context, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, freedom of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, as outlined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Political Constitution of Peru, and those included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
