The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 064–2025-PCM,¹ issued on 16 May 2025, the state of emergency declared in the Districts of Ate, Carabayllo, Comas, Puente Piedra, San Martín de Porres, San Juan de Lurigancho, Villa María del Triunfo and Villa El Salvador in the Province of Lima in the Department of Lima, as well as in the Constitutional Province of Callao, has been extended for a period of 30 calendar days, starting on 17 May 2025.
- This measure has been taken in view of the disruption of internal order caused by the increase in criminal activity and public insecurity resulting from the rise in the crimes of homicide, contract killing, extorsion and illicit drug trafficking, among others, in the above-mentioned districts. In that context, restrictions have been placed on the exercise of the constitutional rights enshrined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Constitution of Peru relating to the inviolability of the home; liberty of movement, by limiting road access for mopeds and motorcycles, which are permitted to circulate with a driver only, without any passengers, and the drivers of such vehicles must not use items or accessories, other than helmets, that obstruct or limit the visibility of the driver's face; freedom of assembly; and liberty and security of person. As a result, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, liberty of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, enshrined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Constitution of Peru, and in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The text of Supreme Decree No. 064-2025-PCM of the Republic of Peru is on file with the Secretary-General and is available for consultation.
