The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 076-2025-PCM, published on 5 June 2025, the state of emergency declared in the provinces of Putumayo and Mariscal Ramón Castilla in the department of Loreto was extended for a period of 60 calendar days starting on 7 June 2025.
- The reason for the extension of the state of emergency is the continuity of activities of hostile groups and other related threats in the aforementioned provinces. In this context, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, freedom of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, as outlined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Political Constitution of Peru, and those included in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
