AMENDMENTS TO UNITED NATIONS REGULATION No. 13

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary,
communicates the following:

Within the period of six months following the date of notification UNECE/TRANS/2024/11 of 12 December 2024 by which the Executive Secretary of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe communicated to the Contracting Parties the proposed amendments to the above United Nations Regulation, none of the Contracting Parties applying the above United Nations Regulation expressed disagreement with the proposed amendments.

Therefore, in accordance with article 12 (2) of the Agreement, the proposed amendments are considered to be adopted and are binding upon all Contracting Parties applying the above United Nations Regulation as of 12 June 2025.
