INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS  
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The above action was effected on 25 March 2026.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 027-2026-PCM,<sup>1</sup> issued on 27 February 2026, a state of emergency was declared in metropolitan Lima (Department of Lima) and in the Constitutional Province of Callao for a period of thirty (30) calendar days, from 28 February 2026.
- This measure was adopted in view of the disruption of internal order caused by the increase in criminal activity and public insecurity resulting from such crimes as homicide, contract killing, extortion, and other related crimes and situations of violence in the aforementioned areas. As a result, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, liberty of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, enshrined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Constitution of Peru, and in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
