INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS  
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The above action was effected on 25 March 2026.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 029-2026-PCM,<sup>1</sup> issued on 7 March 2026, a state of emergency has been declared for a period of sixty (60) calendar days, from 8 March 2026, in the following districts:
  - Anco, Ayna, Santa Rosa, Samugari, Anchiuay, Río Magdalena and Unión Progreso in the Province of La Mar (Department of Ayacucho);
  - Kimbiri, Villa Kintiarina, Villa Virgen, Echarate, Megantoni, Kumpirushiato, Cielo Punco and Manitea in the Province of La Convención (Department of Cusco);
  - Pangoa and Río Tambo in the Province of Satipo (Department of Junín).
  - In addition, the aforementioned Supreme Decree excludes from its scope of application the communities (*centros poblados*) of Puerto Ocopa and Quiteni located in the district of Río Tambo in the Province of Satipo (Department of Junín), as well as the community (*centro poblado*) of Kiteni located in the District of Echarate in the Province of La Convención (Department of Cusco).
  - Similarly, the territorial areas known as the “Camisea gas energy hub” (*Eje Energético del Gas de Camisea*) and the “River-land operational corridor of the Ene River” (*Corredor Operacional Fluvial - Terrestre del Ene*) are excluded.

- This measure was adopted with a view to address such crimes as illicit trafficking in drugs, among other related offences and other situations of violence. As a result, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, liberty of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, enshrined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Constitution of Peru, and in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
