INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS  
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

By Supreme Decree No. 052-2026-PCM,<sup>1</sup> published on 12 April 2026, a state of emergency was declared for a period of sixty (60) calendar days beginning on 13 April 2026 in the following districts of the department of Cajamarca:

- the districts of Encañada and Chetilla in the province of Cajamarca;
- the district of Cachachi in the province of Cajabamba;
- the districts of Sorochuco and Huasmin in the province of Celendín;
- the district of Contumazá in the province of Contumazá;
- the district of Chalamarca in the province of Chota;
- the districts of Hualgayoc, Chugur and Bambamarca in the province of Hualgayoc;
- the districts of San Ignacio and San José de Lourdes in the province of San Ignacio;
- and,
- the district of Gregorio Pita in the province of San Marcos of the department of Cajamarca.

The state of emergency was declared to address the threat to public order and public safety resulting from the increase in illegal mining and related crimes, as well as other situations of violence.

In this regard, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to inviolability of the home, freedom of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, set forth in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Political Constitution of Peru, as well as in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.
