INTERNATIONAL COVENANT ON CIVIL AND POLITICAL RIGHTS
NEW YORK, 16 DECEMBER 1966

PERU: NOTIFICATION UNDER ARTICLE 4 (3)

The Secretary-General of the United Nations, acting in his capacity as depositary, communicates the following:

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations presents its compliments to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, and, in accordance with article 4 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, bearing in mind what is stated in note verbale LA 41 TR/2017/IV-4/Peru/1, dated 1 March 2017, has the honour to report the following:

- By Supreme Decree No. 017-2026-PCM,¹ issued on 4 February 2026, the state of emergency in the Districts of Tambopata, Inambari, Las Piedras and Laberinto, Province of Tambopata, and in the Districts of Madre de Dios and Huepetuhe, Province of Manu, in the Department of Madre de Dios has been extended for a period of 60 calendar days, from 5 February 2026.
- This measure was adopted to continue to implement police operations aimed at combating and neutralizing illegal logging and mining, as well as related crimes (illicit drug trafficking, among others, perpetrated by small-scale and organized crime), which disrupt internal order. As a result, the exercise of the constitutional rights relating to the inviolability of the home, liberty of movement in the national territory, freedom of assembly, and liberty and security of person, enshrined in paragraphs 9, 11, 12 and 24 (f) of article 2 of the Constitution of Peru and in articles 9, 12, 17 and 21 of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights, is restricted.

The Permanent Mission of Peru to the United Nations takes this opportunity to convey to the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, United Nations Secretariat, the renewed assurances of its highest consideration.
