

No. 9884. CUSTOMS CONVENTION ON THE TEMPORARY IMPORTATION OF SCIENTIFIC EQUIPMENT. DONE AT BRUSSELS ON 11 JUNE 1968¹

With the following declaration in respect of article 23:

[TRANSLATION — TRADUCTION]

On depositing the instrument of accession to the Customs Convention on the temporary importation of scientific equipment, the Hungarian People's Republic considers it necessary to declare that the provisions of article 23 of the Convention are not consistent with the principles of contemporary international law and run counter to the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples (1514 (XV)), adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on 14 December 1960,² which proclaims the necessity of bringing to a speedy and unconditional end colonialism in all its forms and manifestations.

Certified statement was registered by the Secretary-General of the Customs Co-operation Council, acting on behalf of the Parties, on 3 May 1976.
