[TRANSLATION² — TRADUCTION³]

“The Federal Republic of Germany holds the view that the second sentence of article 2 of the Protocol does not impose on the State any obligation to finance or assist in financing schools of a denominational or philosophical character, as this matter does not, according to the unanimous declaration of the Committee on Legal Questions of the Consultative Assembly and of the Secretary-General of the Council of Europe, fall within the purview of the Convention of Human Rights and Fundamental Freedoms.”

By a letter dated 28 March 1957 to the Secretariat General of the Council of Europe, the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany declared that the Protocol to the above-mentioned Convention is also applicable to *Land* Berlin, with effect from 13 February 1957, the date of entry into force of the Protocol for the Federal Republic of Germany.

Certified statements were registered by the Council of Europe on 23 April 1957.
