#### DECLARATION by JAMAICA

In a communication addressed to the Swiss Federal Council on 17 July 1964, the Government of Jamaica declared itself bound by the above-mentioned Conventions by virtue of their ratification on 23 September 1957 by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The Conventions entered into force for Jamaica on 6 August 1962, the date of attainment of independence.
