No. 6864. CUSTOMS CONVENTION ON THE A.T.A. CARNET FOR THE TEMPORARY ADMISSION OF GOODS. DONE AT BRUSSELS, ON 6 DECEMBER 1961¹

RATIFICATION and ACCESSION (a)

Instruments deposited with the Secretary-General of the Customs Co-operation Council on :

14 April 1965

Denmark

(To take effect on 15 July 1965; not including Greenland and the Faroe Islands.)

[TRANSLATION — TRADUCTION]

With reference to article 23 of the A.T.A. Convention, Denmark undertakes to accept, with effect from 1 January 1965, article 3, paragraphs 2 and 3, of the said Convention but, in the case of paragraph 2 of the said article 3, to the following extent :

1. With regard to goods temporarily imported under other temporary importation Conventions:

The International Convention to Facilitate the Importation of Commercial Samples and Advertising Material, done at Geneva on 7 November 1952.

2. With regard to goods temporarily imported under the Danish laws and regulations concerning temporary admission :

For the temporary importation of costumes, scenery, etc., which are imported for temporary use in making cinematograph films.

For the temporary importation of motor vehicles which are imported by persons domiciled abroad for temporary use on race-tracks.

For the temporary importation of goods intended for trial or demonstration, provided either that only one article is involved or that the goods cannot be considered to be imported for sale.

Denmark has been applying the A.T.A. carnet system since 1 January 1965.

IRELAND (a)

(To take effect on 16 July 1965; with reservation provided for in article 26 (1), that A.T.A. carnets under the Convention are not accepted for postal traffic.)
