## SUCCESSION by SIERRA LEONE

In a communication addressed to the Swiss Federal Council on 31 May 1965, the Government of Sierra Leone declared itself bound by the above-mentioned four Conventions by virtue of their ratification on 23 September 1957 by the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland. The Conventions entered into force for Sierra Leone on 27 April 1961, the date of attainment of independence.
