

No. 7310. VIENNA CONVENTION ON DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS. DONE AT VIENNA, ON 18 APRIL 1961¹

OBJECTIONS by AUSTRALIA to the reservations concerning paragraph 1 of article 11 of the Convention made by the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Mongolian People's Republic, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and to the reservations to paragraph 2 of article 37 of the Convention made by Cambodia and the United Arab Republic.

By a notification received on 14 March 1968, the Permanent Representative of Australia to the United Nations, on instructions from his Government, informed the General Secretary of the following:

“The Government of the Commonwealth of Australia does not regard the statements concerning paragraph (1) of Article 11 made by the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic, the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics and the Mongolian Peoples' Republic as modifying any rights or obligations under that paragraph.

“The Government of the Commonwealth of Australia declares that it does not recognize as valid the reservations to paragraph 2, Article 37, of the Convention made by the United Arab Republic and by Cambodia.”
