CHINA

“ The Republic of China, a sovereign state and Member of the United Nations, attended the 1968 United Nations Sugar Conference, contributed to the formulation of the International Sugar Agreement of 1968 and signed the Agreement on 16 December 1968. Any statements or reservations relating to the Agreement that are incompatible with or derogatory to the legitimate position of the Government of the Republic of China shall in no way affect the rights and obligations of the Republic of China under the said Agreement. ”

RATIFICATION in the name of CAMBODIA

On becoming a Member of the International Labour Organisation on 24 February 1969, Cambodia recognized that it continues to be bound by the obligations arising from the above-mentioned Conventions, which France had previously declared applicable to the territory of Cambodia. As a result of this undertaking, these Conventions will continue to be in force in Cambodia as from 24 February 1969, the date on which the ratification of the said Conventions in the name of Cambodia were registered by the Director-General of the International Labour Office.
