RATIFICATION by the NETHERLANDS

(With declarations, made under article 35 (4) of the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation,³ to the effect that the Government of the Netherlands accepts without modification, on behalf of and in agreement with the Governments of the Netherlands Antilles and Surinam, the obligations of the Convention. To take effect on 8 October 1972.)
