DECLARATIONS by the UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND made under article 35, paragraph 4, of the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation<sup>2</sup>

A decision is reserved as regards the application of the Convention to (1) Bermuda, British Honduras, Montserrat and the British Virgin Islands, and (2) to the Falkland Islands (Malvinas), St. Helena and the Seychelles.
