The Legal Counsel presents her compliments to the Permanent Representatives to the United Nations and has the honour to communicate the following in relation to the distribution of depositary notifications by the Secretary-General as depositary of multilateral treaties:

In the light of the United Nations' effort to reduce paper consumption and to conserve energy and resources, the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs will discontinue the distribution of the depositary notifications (CNs) on paper per 1 April 2010. The depositary notifications will continue to be accessible electronically. The Treaty Section, which discharges the functions of the Secretary-General in his capacity as depositary of multilateral treaties, has prepared the attached note.

The Legal Counsel of the United Nations avails herself of this opportunity to renew to the Permanent Representatives to the United Nations the assurances of her highest consideration.

INFORMATION RELATING TO DEPOSITARY NOTIFICATIONS

The Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs, which discharges the functions of the Secretary-General in his capacity as depositary of multilateral treaties, advises Member States and others of the status of the multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General through depositary notifications (CNs) which are circulated by electronic mail.

- The distribution of depositary notifications (CNs) in hard-copy will be discontinued as of 1 April 2010 as part of the United Nations efforts to reduce paper waste and conserve energy and resources.
- Electronic copies of the CNs are available on the Internet from the website of the Treaty Section of the Office of Legal Affairs at the following address: http://treaties.un.org/Pages/CNs.aspx?clang=_en (in English) and http://treaties.un.org/Pages/CNs.aspx?clang=_fr (in French). If a CN cannot be found on the website, please contact the Treaty Section.
- All Permanent Missions are urged to subscribe to the Treaty Section's "automated CN subscription service". To subscribe to the Automated CN Subscription Service, you are advised to visit the Treaty Section's website at the following address: <http://treaties.un.org/Pages/Login.aspx> (in English) and http://treaties.un.org/Pages/Login.aspx?clang=_fr (in French). Please see the attached instructions on how to subscribe to this service.
- This service, as with the access to the entire website, is free of charge and enables all interested individuals to directly receive CNs by e-mail for all multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General of the United Nations.

AUTOMATED Subscription Service for Depository Notifications

In order to subscribe to this service, kindly follow the instructions below:

1. Visit the home page of the United Nations Treaty Collection at <http://treaties.un.org/Pages/Home.aspx?lang=en>;
2. On the left under “Frequently Accessed” section, scroll down and click on “Automated CN Subscription Service”;
3. Click on “New User Registration” link;
4. Enter the information requested to open an account;
5. Click on “Submit” button;
6. On “User Login” page enter your Username and Password information;
7. Click on the “Submit” link;
8. Select the desired subscription option: “CN Subscription by Treaty” or “CN Subscription by Participant”. Multilateral treaties deposited with the Secretary-General are grouped under various subject headings, for example, Human Rights, Environment and Disarmament. The system allows to select treaties or subject headings with regard to which the CNs will be transmitted. It also makes it possible to select CNs for actions by one or multiple States or parties. In addition, there is a button for selecting all treaties (“Select All”);
9. Once you have specified the relevant individual treaties, subject headings (organised into “Chapters” and “sub-Chapters”) or participant (s), click on the “Update” link to save your preferences in your subscription profile;
10. When a new treaty or amendment is deposited with the Secretary-General, a separate e-mail will be sent to all subscribers informing them of this fact. Should a user wish to receive CNs on actions to the new treaty or amendment, the subscription profile should be updated by the user to include such treaty (see par. 9 above).
